<u>Queen's Golden Jubilee Celebrations</u> Community Walk 1st July 2012

The Parish Council is organising a community walk on Sunday 1st July 2012 to celebrate the Queen's Golden Jubilee. We would like as many people as possible to participate and consequently, the walk has been designed to suit most levels of fitness.

The walk will start at 11.00 a.m. in the playing field car park alongside the Wagon and Horses and consists of three separate stages to suit different fitness levels, and to cater for younger family members.

The total length of all three walks combined is approximately 8.5 miles, but there are two cut off points which will allow walkers to undertake either a 2 mile walk, a 3.5 mile walk or the full 8.5 mile walk.

A full colour walk guide will be issued to you at the start of your walk and on completion, every participant will receive an Oxspring Jubilee walk badge. You will need good walking shoes as the ground could be muddy in places, and unfortunately the routes are not pushchair or wheelchair friendly as we are trying to follow as much of the Oxspring boundary route as possible which obviously means stiles and uneven ground.

Light refreshments will be on sale at the end of the walk in the playing field and non participants will be able to collect a copy of the walk booklet for later use. Any profits made on the day will be donated to support the Senior's Tea.

Please support our efforts to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee and we look forward to welcoming as many of you as possible you to help us celebrate this special occasion.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling throughout the village is still a big problem. All of the pavements are affected as is the village green and playingfield. Please remember that Dog faeces are a particular danger to children, and can cause many infections including worms and serious damage to the eyes. Dog bins have been provided throughout the village, so please be a responsible owner and pick it up. It is a criminal offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to clean up immediately after their dog has fouled on designated land. Barnsley Council dog wardens have the authority to issue £50 fixed penalty fines to those seen offending or the Council can take formal action resulting in prosecution where a maximum fine of £1000 may be imposed. 

Oxspring Parish Council

Parish Councillors are occasionally asked what the Parish Council does. It is important that Oxspring residents know about, and understand, the duties of the Parish Council, as all residents make a financial contribution to the services supported and projects approved for the village, at Council meetings.

What is a Parish Council?

It is a statutory local authority set up under the Local Government Act 1972 and it operates in the area of a defined civil parish. Oxspring Parish Council is made up of volunteer, elected members who each serve a four year term of office and the Councillors are supported by the Clerk to the Council. This post is salaried for ten hours per week.

What Powers does the Parish Council have?

The Council has a wide range of powers which relate to local matters. They:

- Give views on behalf of the community, on planning applications and other proposals that affect the parish.
- Undertake projects and schemes that benefit local residents
- Work in partnership with other bodies to achieve benefits for the parish
- Alert relevant authorities to problems that arise or work that needs to be undertaken
- Help the other tiers of local government keep in touch with their local communities

How is their work funded?

The property you live in is in a valuation band. The amount of Council Tax you pay to Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council can vary according to the valuation band for your home. Each Parish Council is then allowed to raise a small amount to be added to this Council Tax to pay for local expenditure. This is called the Parish Precept.

How are Precepts Calculated?

Parish Councils can raise revenue to help meet their spending requirements by issuing a Precept. This is the total amount to be raised through the Council Tax from all the dwellings within the Parish area. The Precept is converted into an amount per Council Tax Band that is added onto the Council Tax Bill.

The Parish Council set its annual precept budget for 2012/13 at the first meeting of the New Year and took the decision to keep the precept at the same level as last year.

The precept for Oxspring ranges from £22.84 for those properties in Band A- to £82.24 for properties in Band H. This will raise a precept of £18,906 for this financial year.

What is the Parish Precept spent on?

The Parish Council spends its funding on maintaining or improving sites that it owns in Oxspring such as the allotments, village green, play area, playing field, Anthills, Gordon's Garden and Bower Dell. It also spends it on projects and other issues affecting the Parish.

How can you get involved with the Parish Council

All Parish Council meetings are open to the public (unless Councillors decide to exclude the public for reasons of confidentiality, which very rarely happens).

Speaking – The Parish Council has a ten minute adjournment for public participation at the beginning of each meeting. To facilitate this the relevant part of the agenda is brought forward to the beginning of the meeting so that members of the public can speak and then leave.

Planning Issues - Most people who want to speak to the Parish Council want to talk on planning applications. Some things to bear in mind:

- 1. The Parish Council is not the Planning Authority and do not decide planning applications; BMBC do that. We only recommend to them what we think they should decide.
- 2. If you are objecting it is very important that you write to BMBC as well as coming to our meeting.
- 3. We can only object to an application on valid planning grounds so please don't be disappointed if we don't comment on issues you regard as important, but which by law aren't relevant.
