Oxspring Playingfield – New culvert now installed

You may have seen that parts of Oxspring Playingfield were cordoned off during the summer. This was due to the work undergone to install new culvert piping underneath the full length of the playingfield.

The field previously had an old stone culvert that had collapsed in places, causing the field to often be waterlogged during the winters.

The new culvert will take water that runs off the Trans Pennine Trail beneath the field to the watercourse alongside Sheffield Road. Hopefully this will greatly improve drainage and reduce flooding in that area in the future.

The 2011 Census is coming..

The Census has collected information about the population every 10 years since 1801 (except in 1941). The next census in England and Wales is on March 27th 2011. The census tells the government how many people live where and the types of people they are. This enables decisions to be made on accurate, relevant details. When your form arrives, it needs to be completed and returned so that services for your community/family uses can be identified. The census statistics help work out the amount of funding allocated to services and facilities such as schools, hospitals, emergency services in your area.

Trans Pennine Trail

The Trans Pennine Trail through Oxspring has had major resurfacing works taking place during the latter half of this year, and the work is still ongoing.

A non slip surface dressing will be laid over the new tarmac and soil will be put down either side so that vegetation may re-grow. (The seed bank was kept from removed vegetation). The finished visible surface of the trail will be 2.5m. A softer strip on one side will be suitable for horse riders, and the finished surface will be suitable for cyclists, walkers, pushchairs and mobility scooters. This work has been done by BMBC with external funding that became available through the Local Transport Plan.

Oxspring Parish Sport and Community Centre

Progress has been slow due to recessionary factors rather than lack of effort or enthusiasm. A design brief is being worked on by the 6 trustees of this newly formed registered charity with help from professional consultants funded by a Grassroots grant. The brief will determine the construction costs enabling funding partners to be approached.

In the meantime OPSCC has been approaching charitable trusts to obtain funding to prepare a full scale business plan. This will be required to apply for construction grants. OPSCC's solicitor is currently negotiating with the Parish Council's solicitor over the lease of the land upon which the centre will be built.

Oxspring Playingfield Development

Now that the new culvert is in place, Council members and a local contractor have undertaken further urgent drainage work to the playing surface, and a long term plan for future improvements has been created. The intention is to add a perimeter exercise track suitable for walking, jogging, mobility scooters and prams, and to create a boules pitch. Also planned is a safe access gap in the car park wall at the Thurgoland end of the car park to link to a planned BMBC extension of the pavement up to Blackmoor Lane, so enabling access to the Trans Pennine Trail.

Investigations are also underway into extending the hard surface area to provide a kick wall, youth shelter & tennis. Cricket provision is also being looked at. The Council will apply for a Big Lottery grant to fund the project. Further suggestions are welcome, please contact the Parish Council.
