<u>Update from:</u> Oxspring Open Gardens

The 8th annual Oxspring Open Garden event raised £3,777.88 for Macmillan Cancer Support! This brings total funds raised since the event started to nearly £18,000.00.

A big thank you to all who contributed this year, and who work tirelessly year after year to make the event the success it is!

Macmillan Cancer Support uses money raised in many ways — times have moved on from those first Macmillan nurses who were sent to support people at the very end of their life. Now Macmillan works very hard to support people with a cancer diagnosis and their carers throughout their treatment and beyond. Funds raised are used to provide a wide variety of health professionals, who are able support patients and their carers in many ways, including Doctors, Specialist Nurses, Allied Health Professionals (such as physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, dieticians), Social Workers and Benefit Advisors.

Macmillan have also contributed to and continue to support specialist palliative care units, who care for patients in need during their cancer journey, and for all patients regardless of diagnosis, at the end of life. They also provide grants for patients who incur additional expense as a result of their cancer diagnosis and provide direct information and support through a telephone line to all patients with a cancer diagnosis.

Hence the reason we keep endeavouring to raise the money every year!

Recycling update:

The PTA have sent off three boxes of old ball point pens and felt tipped pens for recycling, for which the PTA will receive 2p per item.

Please don't throw old pens away, but bring them to school to be recycled instead.

101 is now the number to call when you want to contact South Yorkshire Police – when it is less urgent than 999.

When should I call 101?

To report less urgent crime or disorder and for general police enquiries. For example;

- If your car has been stolen
- -If your property has been damaged
- -When you suspect drug use or dealing
- -To report a minor traffic collision
- -To give the police information about crime in your area

How does it work?

The service is available 24 hrs a day, 7 days a week. Visit www.southyorks.police.uk/101 Calls cost 15p per call.

If you are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired you can textphone 18001 101.

Remember in an emergency always call 999

For example when you need an immediate response because a crime is in progress; someone suspected of a crime is nearby; when this is danger to life or when violence is being used or threatened.

Dog Fouling

Dog fouling throughout the village is currently a big problem. In particular the Playingfield and the Village Green are badly affected. Dog bins have been provided throughout the village, so please be a responsible owner and pick it up.

It is a criminal offence for a person in charge of a dog to fail to clean up immediately after their dog fouls on designated land.

Barnsley Council dog wardens have the authority to issue £50 fixed penalty fines to those found offending or the Council can take formal action resulting in prosecution where a maximum fine of £1000 may be imposed.

Please note that used dog fouling bags can be placed in any Barnsley Council litter bin.

Call the Council on 772468 if you witness anyone not clearing up after their dog.

We need funds to help with the running costs of the group mainly for postage and stationary.

We have however now raised enough funds to get a business plan prepared and are working with Barnsley MBC and the FA to identify the basic facility provision.

It looks as if in the current economic climate we will need to do a phased programme with changing facilities first and then a community room.

Once the basic provision for phase one is agreed these can be costed and fed into the business plan to use with applications for the design and construction of the facility.

The planning permission has been renewed and the lease for the site with Oxspring Parish Council is completed and awaiting the final design footprint adding.
