Who are Oxspring Friends?

In 2000 Oxspring Parish Council suggested that an autonomous group be set up to take forward much needed projects and activities for the community and to raise their own funds. Freda Shaw took this on, contacting members of the community who had specific skills, i.e. finance, administration and leadership to name a few and from this the 6 members of the Executive Committee were elected. With the much needed professional help from Voluntary Action Barnsley, a Constitution was set up, approved and signed. A bank account was set up and Oxspring Friends was born.

What did/do they do?

- Harvest supper dance (which was 70s, 80s themed) was a success for several years.
- Children's halloween disco again was a success for several years

Support dwindled for the above, so they were abandoned after only a few years

- New Year's Eve Supper dance (Ceilidh)
- Seniors' Tea with live entertainment

The above two events were successful for many years, but costs increased and numbers dwindled and they were subsequently abandoned.

- Carol Singing Evening
- Indoor Bowling (October until April every Monday afternoon

Only the later two activities remain today. The Carol Singing, although absent during Covid, returns this December.

The Titivators is a sub-group of the Friends, and their roles, (all voluntary), throughout the village, too many to mention here include: litter picking, Christmas tree installation and lighting, gardening duties, including planting and weed control, repairs to walls, benches and inspection, maintenance and repair of the children's playground equipment (including fortnightly checks of playground equipment), fence repairs (where possible), installation of flower troughs on the fence in front of the Willows, grass cutting of the paths in Bower Dell and cutting back trees on the main

roads and around all the village seats.

The Oxspring Friends Now!

Unfortunately, for a variety of reasons the numbers in the original group diminished and in 2019 the group considered dissolving, and allocating any remaining funds to other causes in the village. Then came COVID, when another small group of volunteers called the Oxspring Buddies, set up to ensure that during lock down any vulnerable people in the village had the help and support they needed to get through the crisis. The Chair of Oxspring Parish Council suggested that rather than dissolve Oxspring Friends, as had been planned, that they join forces with the Oxspring Buddies, yet continue under the name Oxspring Friends, (due to bank accounts, formal constitutions etc.) but with a new Committee and therefore a new beginning!

Funds for Oxspring Friends have always been raised by private donations, grants and various fundraising events, the latest of which being this year's Jubilee Celebration day.
